RE: Town Contributions Toward Health Insurance
DATE: 12/01/17

Approval is respectfully requested to increase the Town's contribution amounts toward health insurance premiums for non-union employees. This change would take effect 1/1/18.

Currently, the Town contributes \$407.00 for single coverage and \$1,170.00 for family coverage. The contributions are applied toward any combination of medical, dental and vision premiums and went into effect 1/1/16. No changes were made in 2017. However, 2 new premium tiers were added to the health insurance in 2017: "employee+spouse" and "employee+children". Both tiers cost less than the family tier, but employees falling into either tier benefited from the family contribution amount.

After discussions with Supervisor Bach, Councilwoman Jeffe and our labor attorney Jeff Swiatek of Hodsgon Russ, LLP, the following contribution amounts are recommended for 2018:

- Single: \$467
- Employee+Spouse: \$931
- Employee+Children: \$790
- Family: \$1,340

If approved, the Personnel Policy will be updated to include these changes.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT
MONTH OF NOVEMBER 2017**

The mission of the Town of Aurora Senior Center is to help older adults remain healthy and active through participation in recreational pursuits and to provide leadership and advocacy to ensure the availability of leisure and recreational opportunities for seniors.

ADMINISTRATIVE

On Nov. 2nd I attended the Network in Aging annual meeting which was held at the Grapevine Banquet hall. The featured speaker was Dr. Will Miller and he spoke about "The Importance of Human Connections: How Social Media & A Highly Mobile Society Affect Relationships". Dr. Miller lectured on the family and how it is the personal connection we are missing in today's society. He used a term refrigerator friends referring to a family member or friends who are welcome to open the doors of your fridge. We are sadly lacking as our society becomes media centered, it was an excellent workshop.

I attended our quarterly director's meeting on Nov. 14th at the West Seneca Senior Center. We heard from Oral Health America and Dr. Able from UB School of Dentistry. Dr. Able is the Dean of the Dental School. They were promoting a program at centers on "Oral Health for Older Adults". They are also working to connect seniors to the services offered by UB Dental. We did discuss the transportation issue from our area as it is a drawback.

Erie County Senior Services held their annual Public Hearing at our center on Nov. 9th. The county chooses two locations in Erie County to present their information on the budget and to look for input from the people. Jennifer Woods, Assistant Coordinator of Neighborhood Services, was the moderator for the afternoon which was attended by Commissioner Tim Hogue and other staff members. Our seniors asked many questions and gave comments as where funding needs to focus for seniors in the future.

On Nov. 13th our quarterly inspection of our sprinklers systems and semi-annual inspection and test of the kitchen range hood passed.

In November we hosted 3 University Express programs. The first program was Inside the FBI Behavioral Unit presented by Mike Liwicki, retired FBI agent. Mike spoke about his unit and it was well attended with over 150 people. Our second offering was the Rise and Fall of the Buffalo Mafia presented by Lee Coppola. Lastly our final fall program was Re-Imaging Transportation. Katie O'Sullivan spoke about Uber, Lyft, rapid transit, and more. As we all know transportation is vital in extending seniors lives. On a bright note one of our seniors has become an Uber driver. He is partially retired, volunteers in our kitchen, and flies helicopters on a part-time basis, and comes with excellent references. We look forward to the spring programs.
