

The main purpose will be to determine that every dog in the Town of Aurora has a rabies vaccination. The census will also ensure that all dogs are properly licensed as prescribed by New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets, Article 7 Section 109.

The Village of East Aurora Dog census is nearly completed and the cost is offset when the owners license their dogs.

Section 110 (4) of the Agriculture and Markets Law allows for a fee to be charged for dogs licensed during an enumeration. The Aurora Town Board adopted a resolution for a \$5.00 fee to be imposed for any person applying for a dog or purebred license of dogs identified as unlicensed during the enumeration.

**New York State Minimum Wage Laws****Minimum Wage Act (General Employment)**

The General Industry Minimum Wage Act states that employers must pay all employees in New York State, including most domestic workers, at least \$8.75 per hour.

Certain requirements set under regulations known as "wage orders" may modify the basic rate.

Wage orders are provisions of the minimum wage law that cover jobs in:

- The hospitality and building service industry
- Miscellaneous industries and occupations
- Farming

They set an hourly rate plus overtime and allowances in four General Industry Wage Orders, based on meals and lodging supplied by an employer. You can get these documents at the Forms and Publications link (see left-side navigation bar).

Some industries make allowances for tips; thus they set a lower hourly rate. For example, food service workers may earn \$5.00 per hour because their total compensation includes expected tips.

When the worker must maintain required uniforms, certain allowances also apply.

Other service workers have a minimum rate of \$5.65 per hour.

There are also allowances for meals and lodging supplied by an employer.

NFGD filed with the New York Public Service Commission a revised *pro-forma* Producer Interconnection Agreement ("Revised Interconnection Agreement") to be incorporated in its Gas Transportation Operating Procedures ("GTOP"). The revisions to the Producer Interconnection Agreement are intended to modernize the format of the agreement, remove language that unnecessarily duplicated tariff language, allow for use in both New York or Pennsylvania and otherwise improve administrative efficiency. The Revised Interconnection Agreement was accepted effective August 1, 2014.

Enclosed are two (2) unexecuted originals of the Revised Interconnection Agreement which will replace the existing Interconnection Agreement between Town Of Aurora, any predecessors and/or assignors, and NFGD, dated May 16, 2002, as amended ("Existing Interconnection Agreement"). Please also include a current demonstration of Town Of Aurora's creditworthiness pursuant to Article 10 of the Revised Interconnection Agreement (Article X of the Existing Interconnection Agreement).

Upon verification of Town Of Aurora's acceptable level of creditworthiness, NFGD will countersign and return a fully executed original for your files along with a letter terminating the Existing Interconnection Agreement.

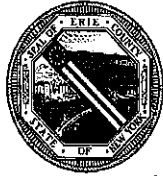

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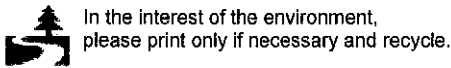



Some local dispatch centers and fire companies in the area use a program that they purchased to document Fire/EMS calls. This program cost tens of thousands of dollars and there were some who wanted to see us get it. CHARMS may not have all the bells and whistles that the other program has, but I feel using the CHARMS system, which can be integrated into the purchased program the fire departments use, our dispatchers are already familiar with CHARMS and it does document calls to everyone's satisfaction is the best way to go and at no cost.

4. Viewed 3 separate webinars regarding gps tracking for our patrol vehicles. In the past Erie County through CPS had or I guess still has a program that works through the MDT's (car computers). The program worked well several years ago but for whatever reasons does not work now. The equipment allows dispatch and supervisors to see real time locations of the patrol vehicles for dispatching and officer safety purposes.
5. I will be purchasing the equipment for the radio enhancements for the Ellicott Rd tower any day now. The county should be installing equipment on the tower next week.

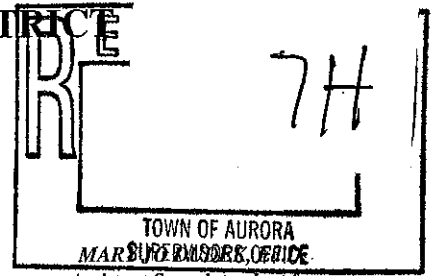
