RESOLUTION TO AMEND AGREEMENT WITH
ERIE COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the Town of Aurora and the Erie County Water Authority have entered into agreements in regard to various water districts in which the Authority operates such districts under a Lease Management Agreement with the Authority, and

WHEREAS, such districts have out-of-district customers who require water service, and

WHEREAS, the Town is presently amending the Town Water Code authorizing the Town to terminate water service for extended delinquency of water charges similar to the authority of the Town for customers within the district, and

WHEREAS, the Codes of the Town of Aurora are being amended to authorize the Erie County Water Authority to provide termination for such delinquencies,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, the Town requests an amendment to the various Lease Management Agreements between the Town and the Erie County Water Authority which would permit the Erie County Water Authority to terminate water service for delinquencies at the request of the Town Board, and be it further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution shall be submitted to the Commissioners of the Erie County Water Authority.

A LOCAL LAW, TO AMEND LOCAL LAW 1-1990 KNOWN AS "THE CODES OF THE TOWN OF AURORA", ADOPTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF AURORA ON JANUARY 22, 1990, BY AMENDING CHAPTER 113 REGARDING _____.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF AURORA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT

This Local Law amends a prior Local Law known as "The Town of Aurora Code" adopted by the Town of Aurora on January 22, 1990, as amended, relating to the administrative, legislative and general legislation of Codes within the Town of Aurora as therein set forth..

SECTION 2. SECTION 113-34, BILLING PROCEDURE; PENALTY FOR LATE PAYMENTS

Section 116-34 is amended to read as follows:

Checks for payments of water district bills and water charges shall be made payable to the water district. Meters will be read and bills rendered at regular quarterly intervals. Bills for the previous quarter shall be due and payable at the office and on the date designated on the bill. Unpaid water charges,

including charges to out-of-district users, in arrears for 30 days or longer shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding 10% of the amount due, and the Water Department and/or Erie County Water Authority may cut off the supply of water if such water charges are not paid within 60 days of the date due. The Town Board may, by rules and regulations, provide for an additional charge for restoring the service of water in addition to the unpaid water bill.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York Secretary of State.

I am seeking Board approval to purchase the remainder of the winter entrance mats for Gleed. We obtained quotes for the 14 remaining winter mats from Dobmeier Janitorial Supply \$2299.79, Lab Safety Supply \$2859.00, and Grainger Entrance Matting for \$3631.65.

I would like to move the necessary funds from the Gleed Janitorial Supplies account to the Building Maintenance account to cover the purchase of these mats.

I feel the investment is cost effective to purchase our own and we will take care of cleaning and rotating the mats. The current invoices from Cintas Corp for monthly leasing of entrance mats for 300 Gleed is **\$1488 per year**. The winter mats will be owned by the town and will pay for themselves within 1½ years. With proper care, these mats should last 10+ years. The savings will be around \$12,000-\$14,000 over the life of the mats.



GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The only event scheduled for August was the annual Toytown Classic Car Show. The show had an average attendance with no major issues, except for one Obstructing arrest of an uncooperative subject on a motorcycle.
2. In addition to Town, Village and staff meetings I conducted several Pistol Permit interviews. I also attended a meeting by the Erie County Clerk's Office regarding Pistol Permit applications. They have been overwhelmed by applications after the Safe Act was enacted and were looking for methods to quicken the application process. As an example there were 2,427 submitted applications in 2012. January through July in 2013 has already produced 2,038 applications.
3. Looking into the future:
 - a. Newly ordered police cars should be coming in mid September. They will be outfitted with new lighting, car cameras and gun racks that will hold both the shotgun and Ruger mini tac .223 cal. Rifle.
 - b. Received the live scan equipment acquired through a grant in 2012. Still waiting for the state to send in an installer.
 - c. Have been approved to receive a video recorder for interviews and interrogations under a grant applied for by the District Attorney's office.
 - d. Still prepping for the upcoming NG-911 system expected to be operational by the end of the year.
 - e. Looking into purchasing a thermal imager through asset forfeiture money. Thermal imagers can seek out heat sources with clarity, which will be a useful tool when scanning for missing persons or looking for perpetrators.
