Peggy Cooke and Joe Orlowski stated that the Town Recreation Department has plans to expand the baseball diamonds at 300 Gleed and Greg Merkle is here to present a \$1500 check from The Greater Buffalo Sports Hall of Fame, Inc. Supervisor Jeffe thanked Mr. Merkle for the generous donation.

## BUSINESS FROM BOARD MEMBERS/LIAISONS:

Councilman Harris noted he had attended the meeting on the gas facility expansion (compressor station) and stated he sees good and bad aspects of the project. Mr. Harris would like to contact National Fuel to see if they would bring a turbine to the site for "noise sampling".

Councilman Bach stated, with regard to the Gleed bond issue, best interests are sought by either side. Mr. Bach noted that East Aurora is unique because of people, not buildings and we need to respect each others opinions.

Councilman Collins commended Chief Krowka and the EAPD on the quality of the work they are doing for the community.

Supervisor Jeffe : 1) attended the public hearing on the redistricting of the Erie County legislature districts. Mrs. Jeffe noted that she and other supervisors and mayors in the proposed "mega district" are not satisfied with the plan and are opposed to it since the district would be approximately 45% of Erie County and would cover 22 municipalities. Supervisor Jeffe stated that the legislative representative needs to know the strengths and weaknesses of community he/she serves as well as the geography of the region, including roads and other infrastructure. 2) Stated she will be visiting the gas compressor site on Reiter Road with Legislator Mills. 3) Noted that the residents elected the Board to represent them and this Board will continue to work whichever way the vote on 6/14 turns out.

## AUDIENCE II:

Tony Rosati, Center Street, commented on the purchase of the Kabota tractor and asked if the State or anyone will help to cover the cost of the tractor.

Carol Cameron, Kandahar Drive., asked at what meeting was the budget adopted for the Gleed referendum.

### STAFF REPORTS:

Highway Superintendent Gunner stated that there will be a temporary travel restriction on Grover Road due to a gas line being installed. Mr. Gunner introduced Michael Evans, a new highway employee who will be starting June 20, 2011.

Peggy Cooke stated that on-line registration for recreation programs is going great and that credit card make up 49% of on-line sales. Mrs. Cooke noted that the Hamlin Park tennis court will be resurfaced by the Village in the near future. Tomorrow the Pedestrian Bicycle Board will be initiating the "crossing flags" at several pedestrian crossings on Main Street.
