Councilman Bach moved to adopt the following resolution in support of a Veterans Cemetery at Knox Farm State Park; seconded by Councilwoman Friess:

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE ESTABLISHEMENT OF A VETERANS CEMETERY IN KNOX FARM STATE PARK

WHEREAS, the Town of Aurora strives to be a place where military veterans can feel at ease; and

WHEREAS, Western New York is the home of approximately 200,000 veterans,

including those who live more than 75 miles from the nearest Veterans Cemetery; and

WHEREAS, the Town believes that because of the long history of military service in this area and the presence here of so many who have sacrificed and served; it is important to provide a permanent memorial here recognizing their lives and that service, and a cemetery would provide a final resting place of dignity and beauty, and would acknowledge their service and sacrifice and the value we place upon it; and

WHEREAS, Veterans Affairs (VA) officials have been trying to locate a Western New York site for a Veterans Cemetery since August, 2010 and a third new site selection effort was announced by VA officials on March 2, 2012; and

WHEREAS, this effort focuses within a 50 mile diameter area, which includes the Town of Aurora, and parts of Erie, Orleans, Niagara and Genesee Counties, and

WHEREAS, the Knox Farm State Park offers an ideal option within the selected area that provides serene, open meadows, surrounded by acres of natural habitat, and enables easy access via Route 400, a major highway; and

WHEREAS, the Village of East Aurora provides the ideal offering of hotels, bed and breakfasts, restaurants and shops for future Veterans Cemetery visitors; and

WHEREAS, many residents, local veterans, the East Aurora Chamber of Commerce, and several elected officials have expressed their strong desire for the consideration by the VA of a portion of Knox Farm State Park for this cemetery; and

WHEREAS, supporting this endeavor is not only a way to remember those who died for their country, but also those who were prepared to make the supreme sacrifice for their country in defense of those sacred ideals of liberty, freedom, and justice for all.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Aurora supports the consideration of a portion of Knox Farm State Park as a Veterans Cemetery serving Western New York; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Veterans Affairs Office in Washington, D.C., Governor Andrew Cuomo, Senator Charles Schumer, Senator Patrick Gallivan, Assemblywoman Jane Corwin, and New York State Parks Commissioner Rose Harvey.
