The Building Department reviewed the construction of the balconies on your addition to your residence at 1450 Olean Rd. The balconies fail to meet the requirements of the Town of Aurora Code for projection into required yards in the Rural Residential/Agriculture (RR/A) zoning district in which it is located.

Section 116-28(D) – Balconies, bay windows, chimneys and roof projections not exceeding three feet.

Requested: Two balconies projecting 3'10" from house wall.

Variance: 10 inches

If you wish to pursue this matter further you must apply to the Town of Aurora Zoning Board of Appeals for an area variance. You must include your application and fee, a letter to the ZBA explaining your difficulty, any information to support your need for a variance from the Town Code.

In consideration of the 2nd Floor Porches and are as follows:
