Confirming our recent conversation, I have attempted to obtain proposals from local sign shops for the signs that will be installed over the entry porticos at the new facility, and in the Board Room.

The exterior signs will be 36" diameter, carved/sandblasted High Density Urethane (HDU). The consensus on the 30" diameter interior signs was that they be medium grained wood, carved and sandblasted.

I have only been able to locate 2 area sign shops that can manufacture the required signs - Visual Impact Signs in East Aurora, and Fast Signs on Walden Avenue. I have attached the proposals from each for your information. The quotes reeved were as follows:

- Fast Signs \$4,350.40 (excluding tax)
- Visual Impact: \$3,440 (excluding tax)

It is my recommendation that the Town Board award the sign work to Visual Impact.

In the event SELLER should determine that the weather conditions are such that an unsafe or hazardous condition may exist, SELLER shall have the exclusive right to postpone the starting time of the display and/or delay the display in its entirety until conditions have improved and are appropriate for the safety of all involved or until the inclement weather date as set forth herein above. If for any reason the display cannot be presented at all, 10% of contract is due to Skylighters of New York, LLC.
- 2. <u>INSURANCE</u>: SELLER agrees to provide a Certificate of Insurance showing SELLER and BUYER to be insured and covered for \$5,000,000 Each Accident; \$5,000,000 General Aggregate; \$5,000,000 products-comp/ops Agg. SELLER will obtain and keep in force Workers Compensation insurance, including employees liability to the full statutory limits. In the event greater liability insurance limits are required, the additional cost will be paid by BUYER. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the SELLER agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the BUYER. 





Arrests / Investigations

- Besides the arrests and reported crimes in the above chart, Officers also investigated the following:
 - Officers assisted a local resident and news reporter with a harassment complaint (threats of violence), which was handled directly through the District Attorneys Office
 - Several youths were dispersed from the area of the Healthy Zone Ice Rink when bystanders felt a fight was about to break out.
 - A complainant called the station after having another vehicle strike hers in a village parking lot. The complainant reporter that the other vehicle left the area and a brief conversation, and the complainant felt the other driver may be intoxicated. West Seneca Police found the other vehicle in their town and the operator was arrested for DWI.
 - An 18 yo Wales man was charged with several vials of concentrated cannabis and was also in possession of several thousands of dollars.
 - A 57 yo Delevan man was arrested for driving while impaired by drugs after a one vehicle accident.
 - Patrols were dispatched to the Kelly Drive apartments after midnight one evening on a report of shots fired. Investigation found that a tenant hand discharged his .22 cal rifle into the ground, within 50 yds of his apartment building. The tenant was arrested.
