RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE TOWN ASSESSOR, PURSUANT TO NYS GOVERNOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDER 202.83 CONTINUING TEMPORARY SUSPENSION AND MODIFICATION OF LAWS RELATING TO THE PANDEMIC DISASTER EMERGENCY, SPECIFICALLY AS IT PERTAINS TO SENIOR AND DISABILITY EXEMPTIONS, SECTION 467 AND 459C OF THE REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW, TO GRANT EXEMPTIONS ON THE 2021 ASSESSMENT ROLL TO ALL PROPERTY OWNERS WHO RECEIVED THAT EXEMPTION ON THE 2020 ASSESSMENT ROLL, THEREBY DISPENSING WITH THE NEED FOR RENEWAL APPLICATIONS FROM SUCH PERSONS, AND FURTHER DISPENSING WITH THE REQUIREMENT FOR ASSESSORS TO MAIL RENEWAL APPLICATIONS TO SUCH PERSONS

WHEREAS, on March 7, 2020, Andrew M. Cuomo, Governor of the State of New York issued Executive Order Number 202, declaring a State disaster emergency for the entire State of New York; and

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 202.83, a portion of which includes a local option pertaining to Senior Citizens' and Persons with Disabilities' partial property tax exemption, Subdivisions 7, 7-a and 8 of Section 459-c of the Real Property Tax Law (Partial Tax Exemption for Persons with Disabilities), and Subdivisions 5, 5-a, 5-b, 5-c and 6 of Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law (Partial Tax Exemption for Low Income Senior Citizens), to the extent necessary to permit the governing body of an assessing unit to adopt a resolution directing the assessor to grant exemptions pursuant to such section on the 2021 assessment roll to all property owners who received either of those exemption on the 2020 assessment roll, unless there has been a change in status that would no longer qualify the homeowner, dispensing with the need for renewal applications from such persons, and further dispensing with the requirement for assessors to mail renewal applications to such persons; and

WHEREAS, the Town is desirous to adopt such resolution while also allowing the assessor to require a renewal application to be filed when the assessor has reason to believe that an owner who qualified for the exemption on the 2020 assessment roll may have since changed primary residence, added another owner to the deed, transferred the property to a new owner, or died;

NOW,THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Board of the Town of Aurora directs the Town Assessor, pursuant to the NYS Governor's Executive Order 202.83 Continuing Temporary Suspension and Modification of Laws relating to the pandemic disaster emergency, specifically as it pertains to Senior and Disability Exemptions, Section 467 and 459c of the Real Property Tax Law, to grant exemptions on the 2021 Assessment Roll to all property owners who received that exemption on the 2020 Assessment Roll, except in the case that there is a change of status that would no longer qualify the homeowner, thereby dispensing with the need for renewal applications from such persons, and further dispensing with the requirement for assessors to mail renewal applications to such persons.

#### EXECUTIVE ORDER

#### Continuing Temporary Suspension and Modification of Laws Relating to the Disaster Emergency

WHEREAS, on March 7, 2020, I issued Executive Order Number 202, declaring a State disaster emergency for the entire State of New York; and

WHEREAS, both travel-related cases and community contact transmission of COVID-19 have been documented in New York State and are expected to continue;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ANDREW M. CUOMO, Governor of the State of New York, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 29-a of Article 2-B of the Executive Law to temporarily suspend or modify any statute, local law, ordinance, order, rule, or regulation, or parts thereof, of any agency during a State disaster emergency, if compliance with such statute, local law, ordinance, order, rule, or regulation would prevent, hinder, or delay action necessary to cope with the disaster emergency or if necessary to assist or aid in coping with such disaster, or to provide any directive necessary to respond to the disaster, do hereby continue the suspensions and modifications of law, and any directives not superseded by a subsequent directive, contained in Executive Orders 202.36, 202.37, 202.46, 202.47, 202.54, 202.58, 202.59, 202.65, and 202.70, as continued and contained in Executive Order 202.76, for another thirty days through January 17, 2021, and hereby temporarily suspend or modify the following from the date of this Executive Order through January 17, 2021:

- Subdivisions 7, 7-a and 8 of section 459-c of the Real Property Tax Law, and subdivisions 5, 5-a, 5-b, 5-c and 6 of section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law, to the extent necessary to permit the governing body of an assessing unit to adopt a resolution directing the assessor to grant exemptions pursuant to such section on the 2021 assessment roll to all property owners who received that exemption on the 2020 assessment roll, thereby dispensing with the need for renewal applications from such persons, and further dispensing with the requirement for assessors to mail renewal applications to such persons. Provided however, that the governing body may, at its option, include in such resolution procedures by which the assessor may require a renewal application to be filed when he or she has reason to believe that an owner who qualified for the exemption on the 2020 assessment roll may have since changed his or her primary residence, added another owner to the deed, transferred the property to a new owner, or died;
- Notwithstanding any law or regulation to the contrary, health care providers are relieved of recordkeeping requirements to the extent necessary for health care providers to perform tasks as may be necessary to respond to the COVID-19 outbreak, including, but not limited to requirements to maintain medical records that accurately reflect the evaluation and treatment of patients, or requirement to assign diagnostic codes or to create or maintain other records for billing purposes. Any person acting reasonably and in good faith under this provision shall be afforded absolute immunity from liability for any failure to comply with any recordkeeping requirement. In order to protect from liability any person acting reasonably and in good faith under this provision, requirements to maintain medical records;
- Executive Order 202.76, which provided that all suspensions of the Family Court Act shall remain in effect until December 18, 2020, is hereby modified to provide that all suspensions of the Family Court Act shall remain in effect until the expiration of this Executive Order, as extended or modified by future Executive Order.

Chapter 125 of 2020 enacting the COVID-19 Rent Relief Act to the extent necessary to authorize the
payment of rent relief as otherwise provided in such Act, without requiring that a tenant provide proof
that they were paying more than 30 percent of gross monthly income towards rent prior to March, 2020.

IN ADDITION, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 29-a of Article 2-B of the Executive Law to issue any directive during a disaster emergency necessary to cope with the disaster, I hereby issue the following directive for the period from the date of this Executive Order through January 17, 2021:

The authority of the Commissioner of Taxation and Finance to abate late filing and payment penalties pursuant to section 1145 of the Tax Law is hereby modified as necessary to expand the Commissioner's authority to also authorize the abatement of interest by the Commissioner, for a period of 91 days, for restaurants and other food service establishments that are required to file returns and remit sales and use taxes by December 21, 2020, for the sales tax quarterly period that ended November 30, 2020, and that were required to cease indoor dining by Executive Order 202.81 or by Executive Order 202.68 because they are located in an area that was designated an "orange zone" on December 18, 2020.

Motion to extend all current Town appointments to the January 14, 2021 Organizational meeting.



The village witnessed a traffic "issue" and neighborhood problem during the Halloween celebrations and the Boies Road/Emery Road and Schopper areas are presently beset with daily high traffic, road wear, people on non lighted roads, culvert destruction, parking abuses, large gatherings of non town residents, dangerous road access for emergency vehicles and a general disregard for the peace, detrimental to the neighborhood and abutting properties.

#### The codes in question:

116-34 Signs: May only be illuminated by sight of constant color and itensity. No flashing, rotating or moving lights...(excluding Christmas or similar holiday lighting may be used). May not be illuminated.

3). May not be illuminated from within or illuminated by neon or similiar devices of technology.

**116.81 e:** ...traffic,glare...or electrical interference that may create a nuissance to abutting properties or to be detrimental to the character of the neighborhood.

Neighborhood, town harmony and daily peace are expected and not unreasonable as taxpayers. We recognize the right of homeowners to have reasonable holiday celebratory lighting as detailed in section 116-34. We maintain that section 116-34 signs of the building code does not waive the town of Aurora in its responsibility to enforce safe traffic flow in a reasonable manner nor waive resident(s) from respecting the town's laws to not create a nuissance for a neighborhood, respecting abutting properties to that "holiday" decoration, limit glare to abutting properties, adversely impact a neighborhood's technological communications or cause adverse impact on a town resident's property values and/or health of residents, pets, and wildlife.

We ask the Town to amend the building code to issue enforceable regulations for reasonable holiday decorations, time periods, and windows for said "events." Such recommended amendments to the code should include:

- a) The size of referenced holiday "signs" (see lighting or decorations) shall be secured homes and property structures and extend no more than 20 feet from homes or buildings. Variances over this amount shall be by permit issued by the building inspector, chief of police, and a member of the town board and be submitted for review no later than thirty(30) days before "holiday.) Note: owner of 1840 Boies road in interviews to local papers and TV stations recorded their decorations as 15,000 and "next year will be bigger."
- b) In the interest of public safety and maintaining a positive character of the neighborhood

we ask the Town of Aurora to provide the authority for the Chief of Police to issue "no parking" areas up to four (4) weeks duration. Said "no parking" shall be to provide safe access for emergency vehicles, limit adverse impact to a neighborhood, reasonable quality of life.

As town residents we all have the right to celebrate special occassions and holidays. We all have the right to display ornaments, lights on our properties in accordance to reasonableness and adherence as detailed in section 116-34. We, however, maintain that section 116-34 signs of the building code does not waive the town of Aurora in its responsibility to enforce safe traffic flow in a reasonable manner and resident(s) from respecting the town's laws to not create a nuissance for a neighborhood, the abutting properties to that "holiday" decoration, limit glare to abutting properties, adversely impact a neighborhood's technological communications or cause adverse impact on a town resident's property values and/or health of residents, pets, and wildlife. To that end, we ask the Town of Aurora to positively act on this request

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE:**

#### Reports:

- We have 13,562 members registered in our recreation system
- We had 98 individual program registrations in the month of November
- We generated \$475 in sales for November
- Credit card purchases totaled 61% (100% on-line, 0% office)

 Total sales from 1/1/20 – 9/30/2020 \$130,101

Winterfest 2021 planning continues. We have been in contact with many of the surrounding recreation departments, our instructors, and local businesses. It is challenging to navigate the ever changing COVID environment, but we are hopeful for the future.

EAST continues to practice at the University at Buffalo. We are grateful for the pool time we have and continue to look for additional space to get our athletes in the water.

Chris has joined a coalition of aquatic professionals aimed at getting pools opened in Western NY, the Finger Lakes Region, and Central NY. Aquatics are the safest activities we can do during the pandemic. The New Jersey Swim Safety Alliance put together a study on the number of incidents and possible spread of COVID-19 in indoor pools in the state. They found in the 60 facilities and over 325,000 patrons (since reopening July 2<sup>nd</sup>) polled, there have been 0 people infected in them. With the summer of 2021 6 months away now, we fear that there will be an increase in the already leading cause of accidental death in young children, drowning.
