October 10, 2023

A meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Aurora took place on Tuesday, October 10, 2023, beginning at 7:00 p.m. immediately after the work session. The Board met in-person at the Aurora Municipal Center, 575 Oakwood Avenue, East Aurora, New York. The meeting was streamed via Zoom and YouTube.

Supervisor Bach opened the regular meeting at 7:00 p.m., following the conclusion of the work session.

Supervisor Bach opened the Public Hearing on the use of Federal Community Development funds in the Town of Aurora at 7:01 p.m.. The notice was published in the East Aurora Advertiser, posted on the Town Clerk's bulletin board and posted on the Town website. The Supervisor asked if anyone wished to comment.

Hearing no one, Supervisor Bach closed the hearing at 7:02 p.m.

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The next item on the agenda was a Public Hearing on a proposed family golf center on Olean Road (600 Olean; SBL#176.00-4-25.1). Supervisor Bach opened the public hearing at 7:03p.m. The notice was published in the East Aurora Advertiser, posted on the Town Clerk's bulletin board and posted on the Town website. The Supervisor asked if anyone wished to comment.

Harrison Kelly, Grover Road, owner of the property, spoke to the Board. Mr. Kelly stated he is seeking a zoning change to C2 from RR and A to accommodate the proposed golf center. The project would be in three phases with the first phase being indoor mini golf and golf simulators. Mr. Kelly is requesting to have 10 of the 14 acres rezoned, leaving a 4-acre buffer parcel to the south.

Councilman Granville asked if there would be a buffer where the property abuts Olean Road. Mr. Kelly responded there would be green space, parking lot, green space and then the building. He also noted that a tree survey was done of all 14 acres and that less than 2% of the pine trees would be removed, but replaced with other trees in various locations and all the dead ash trees would come down.

Councilman Wochensky noted this is a two-phase decision – first is the zoning and second is the use permit for the project if the rezoning takes place. Mr. Kelly stated this golf center plan is consistent with the Comprehensive plans for Olean Road which is earmarked for business in this area and that there are businesses along that stretch of Olean Road.

Therese Campanelli, Olean Street, spoke in opposition of the rezoning.

Sam Reedy, Olean Road, spoke in opposition of the rezoning.

Tim Sonner, 480 Olean Road business owner, spoke in favor of the rezoning.

Greg Schneider, Quaker Road, spoke in favor of the rezoning.

Rod Simeone, Byeberry Court, stated he is not advocating for or against the rezoning, but offered the following points: the Comprehensive Plan designates Olean Road as commercial; since properties change hands the Board should lock in tight guidelines; a driving range has noise, and the 4-acre wooded buffer is a good idea.

Hearing no further comments, the Supervisor closed the hearing at 7:17 p.m.
