October 26, 2015

A meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Aurora took place on Monday, October 26, 2015, at 7:00 p.m. in the Southside Municipal Center Town Hall Auditorium, 300 Gleed Avenue, East Aurora, New York.

Supervisor Bach opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Supervisor Bach gave a PowerPoint presentation of the Town's 2016 Preliminary Budget. Mr. Bach reviewed what the Town taxes cover, including administration, dog control, recreation and parks, building maintenance, senior programs, snow plowing, road maintenance and police services (via contract with the Village of East Aurora). Some impacts on expenses are workers compensation, minimum wage increase and utility cost increases. Supervisor Bach noted that this budget came in under the tax cap.

The first item on the agenda was a PUBLIC HEARING on the 2016 Preliminary Budget. The Notice of Public Hearing was printed in the East Aurora Advertiser as evidenced by the Affidavit of Publication and posted on the Town Clerk bulletin board as noted by the Affidavit of Posting. The Supervisor opened the hearing at 7:12 p.m. and asked if anyone in the audience wished to comment on the 2016 Preliminary Budget. Hearing no one, the Supervisor closed the hearing at 7:13 p.m.

The next item on the agenda was a PUBLIC HEARING on the use of Federal Community Development funds also known as Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). The notice was published and posted as noted by the Affidavits of Publication and Posting. Supervisor Bach opened the hearing at 7:14 p.m. and asked if anyone in the audience wished to address this topic. Hearing no one, the public hearing was closed at 7:14 p.m.

Councilwoman Jeffe moved to approve the minutes of the OctoberAction # 33013, 2015 Town Board meeting; seconded by Councilman Snyder. Upon a10/13/15vote being taken: ayes – threenoes – noneMotion carried.minutesapproved.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Councilman Snyder moved to adopt the following Local Law; seconded by Councilwoman Jeffe:

TOWN OF AURORA LOCAL LAW 4 - 2015

A LOCAL LAW, TO AMEND LOCAL LAW 1-1990 KNOWN AS "THE CODES OF THE TOWN OF AURORA", ADOPTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF AURORA ON JANUARY 22, 1990, BY AMENDING THE VETERAN'S EXEMPTION TO PROVIDE AN EXEMPTION FOR COLD WAR VETERANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF AURORA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT

This Local Law amends a prior Local Law known as "The Codes of the Town of Aurora", adopted by the Town of Aurora on January 22, 1990, as amended, relating to the administrative, legislative and general legislation of the Codes within the Town of Aurora as herein set forth.

SECTION 2. <u>CHAPTER 101, ARTICLE IV, "COLD WAR VETERANS EXEMPTION"</u> Chapter 101 is amended by adopting changes to Article IV as set forth herein:

Section 101-12

The purpose of this Article is to provide a veterans exemption of real property taxation allowable pursuant to Section 458-b of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York and shall be known as "Cold War Veterans Exemption Local Law".

Section 101-13

Section 101-13 is added to provide for the following in accordance with Real Property Tax Law Section 458-b:

A. Qualifying residential real property shall be exempt from taxation to the extent of ten percent (10%) of the assessed value of such property; provided, however, that such exemption shall not exceed eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) or the product of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) multiplied by the latest state equalization rate for the Town of Aurora, New York, whichever is less.

B. In addition to the exemption provided by Paragraph A of this subdivision, where the Cold War Veteran received a compensation rating from the United States Veterans Affairs or from the United States Department of Defense because of service-connected disability, qualifying residential property shall be exempt from taxation to the extent of the product of the assessed valuation of property, multiplied by 50% of the Cold War veteran disability rating; provided, however, that such exemption shall not exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000.00) or the product of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000.00) multiplied by the latest equalization rate for the Town of Aurora, New York, whichever is less.

C. The exemption provided by Paragraph A of this subdivision shall be granted for a period of ten (10) years. The commencement of such ten (10) year period shall be governed by Real Property Tax Law Section 458-b.

Councilwoman Jeffe moved to adopt the following resolution; seconded by Councilman Snyder:

<u>RESOLUTION REGARDING MAINTENANCE</u> <u>OF THE EAST FILLMORE BRIDGE</u>

WHEREAS, the Town of Aurora sought a Declaratory Judgment from the New York Supreme Court identifying the responsibility for the supervision and control of the Brooklea bridge located in the Village of East Aurora, and

WHEREAS, an Order granted on October 20, 2015 by the Hon. John A. Michalek, J.S.C., entered a Judgment declaring that the Town of Aurora is responsible for the expenses of repairing any bridge other than the Brooklea bridge located within the boundaries of the Village of East Aurora, with respect to which the Village of East Aurora has not assumed control, care and maintenance under Section 6-606 of the Village Law, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Aurora has filed a notice appealing the decision of Justice Michalek, and

WHEREAS, the Village of East Aurora has declined to repair the East Fillmore bridge and has closed the bridge, prohibiting property owners and others from the use of the East Fillmore bridge, and also raising concerns about access by emergency vehicles, and

WHEREAS, although the Town contends it is not responsible for repairing the bridge, it is concerned that the declination by the Village to make the necessary repairs results in a hardship to the residents of the Village of East Aurora and the concerns regarding access by emergency vehicles, and

WHEREAS, without prejudice in its appeal of the decision of Justice Michalek, the Town has solicited quotes for the repair of the East Fillmore bridge having received the lowest bid from Creative Concrete for the sum of \$10,300.00, and

WHEREAS, the expenditure of taxpayer funds by the Town is in question pending its responsibility to be determined by the appeal of the existing Order with no final resolution,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, the Town, without prejudice to its rights in the pending matter of the responsibility of maintenance and repairs to the East Fillmore bridge in the Village of East Aurora, does hereby authorize the expenditure of \$10,300.00 for repairs necessary in order to open access over the East Fillmore bridge, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby authorize an agreement with Creative Concrete for the sum of \$10,300.00 for the immediate repair and maintenance of the East Fillmore bridge to benefit the citizens of the Village of East Aurora and Town of Aurora for convenience and safety, and be it further

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this Resolution shall be provided to Bryan Gazda, Village Administrator and Alan Kasprzak, Mayor of the Village of East Aurora.

Upon a vote being taken: ayes – three noes – none Motion carried.

Councilman Snyder moved to authorize the Supervisor to sign the contract/agreement documents with National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation (NFGD) to sell natural gas (from the Majors Park gas wells) to NFGD. Councilwoman Jeffe seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken: ayes – three noes – none Motion carried.

Councilwoman Jeffe moved to approve the following budget amendments to cover the cost of the East Fillmore bridge repairs: Transfer \$11,000 from A1990 Contingency to A9901 Interfund

Transfer Create Capital Project Fund H4 East Fillmore Bridge Increase Capital Project Fund H4 by \$11,000 Add appropriation line H4 5120 Maintenance of Bridges Councilman Snyder seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken: ayes – three noes – none Motion carried.

Councilman Snyder moved to approve the request from Joshua Penfold/Protelcom to continue to lease office space at the Southside Municipal Center, 300 Gleed Ave., E. Aurora, NY, on a month-to-month term beginning 11/1/2015 at a rate of \$408 per month. Councilwoman Jeffe seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken: ayes – three noes – none Motion carried.

Councilwoman Jeffe stated she visited the Springbrook Shores patio home development in Elma to gain perspective as to what the Aurora Mills project may look like. The Elma project consists of 150 units that were constructed over a period of 7 years.

Supervisor Bach stated he attended a foreclosure seminar (zombie/vacant homes). Mr. Bach noted that this is becoming a real problem in Aurora and pressure needs to be put on the banks to speed-up the foreclosures and maintain the properties.

Deborah Carr-Hoagland, E. Fillmore Ave., speaking as a resident, not as a Village Trustee, asked several questions about the Brooklea Bridge – who approved the notice to appeal; who is paying for it; and what are the Town's legal expenses to-date for this issue.
