Vacant land on Blakely Rd., O.D.A.

I am respectfully submitting an ODA for the Town Board's Review. The ODA is located on Blakely, just north east of the Boise Rd. intersection and consists of 1.98 acres+/-. There is a 50 foot easement with plans for a 20 foot driveway to access the property. The lot in question sets 500 feet back and has an easement agreement in place. A topography map of the property reveals a gradient downhill toward the northeast approaching a pre-existing pond. There is a "hammerhead" turnaround proposed at the house. My only concern in regard to fire safety is the distance off the road (500+ feet). Perhaps a dry hydrant or a sprinkler system may be appropriate. This can be your condition of approval, if you so wish.

I recommend the approval of this ODA for the following reasons:

- 1. The land to be developed is of such character that it can be used safely for building a home.
- Access roadway/driveway will be a minimum of 20 feet wide, composed of hardpan composite, included into a 50 foot utility easement.
- 3. The Easement Agreement is created and signed by both parties.
- The Petitioner is only building one single family home at this location.
- The accumulated groundwater produced from this home will be collected and diverted to the northeast of the property, spilling into a pre-existing pond.



THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. The insurance law is amended by adding a new section 2353 to read as follows:
- S 2353. FIREARM OWNERS INSURANCE POLICIES. 1. ANY PERSON IN THIS
 STATE WHO SHALL OWN A FIREARM SHALL, PRIOR TO SUCH OWNERSHIP, OBTAIN AND
 CONTINUOUSLY MAINTAIN A POLICY OF LIABILITY INSURANCE IN AN AMOUNT NOT
 LESS THAN ONE MILLION DOLLARS SPECIFICALLY COVERING ANY DAMAGES RESULTING FROM ANY NEGLIGENT OR WILLFUL ACTS INVOLVING THE USE OF SUCH FIREARM
 WHILE IT IS OWNED BY SUCH PERSON. FAILURE TO MAINTAIN SUCH INSURANCE
 SHALL RESULT IN THE IMMEDIATE REVOCATION OF SUCH OWNER'S REGISTRATION,
 LICENSE AND ANY OTHER PRIVILEGE TO OWN SUCH FIREARM.
- 11 2. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, A PERSON SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE THE
 12 OWNER OF A FIREARM IF SUCH FIREARM IS LOST OR STOLEN UNTIL SUCH LOSS OR
 13 THEFT IS REPORTED TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OR SHERIFF WHICH HAS JURIS14 DICTION IN THE COUNTY, TOWN, CITY OR VILLAGE IN WHICH SUCH OWNER
 15 RESIDES.
- 16 3. ANY PERSON WHO OWNS A FIREARM ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION
 17 SHALL OBTAIN THE INSURANCE REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION WITHIN THIRTY DAYS
 18 OF SUCH EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 19 4. THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION SHALL NOT APPLY TO ANY PEACE OFFICER 20 WHO IS AUTHORIZED TO CARRY A FIREARM.
- 21 5. THE DEPARTMENT IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO PROMULGATE 22 RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS 23 SECTION.
- S 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall have become a law, provided, however, that effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date is authorized to be made and completed on or before such date.

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A RESOLUTION TO BE SUBMITTED BY LEGISLATORS RATH, MILLS, DIXON, HARDWICK & LORIGO

Re: Opposing the New York SAFE Act of 2013

WHEREAS, on January 14, 2013, the NY SAFE (Secure Ammunition and Firearms Enforcement) Act of 2013 was introduced to the New York State Assembly and Senate; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Senate passed the thirty-nine page overhaul of the state's gun law the same day, while the assembly considered the bill a few more hours before passing it on January 15, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Governor signed the bill into law the same day, on January 15, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the celerity of passage of this law is remarkable for the state legislature and Governor, though lamentably not admirable in this particular instance; and

WHEREAS, although certain aspects of the law appear to be thoughtful approaches to reduce instances of gun violence involving New Yorker's, others appear to be knee-jerk reactions made without the benefit of appropriate contemplation at best, or, at worst, disingenuous fee grabs cloaked as security measures; and

WHEREAS, the Webster provision's stiffer penalties for individuals who murder first responders in the course of their duties is appropriate and overdue; and

WHEREAS, the provision protecting information about registered gun owners is an effective way to reduce information to individuals who seek to commit crimes against an individual because of his or her status as gun owner, or not having the protection provided by a gun; and

WHEREAS, the provisions addressing mental health appear to be thoughtful efforts to address individuals who may use a weapon for illegal and violent purposes; and

WHEREAS, similarly, the safe storage provisions appear to be measures to keep weapons away from individuals who are shown to be more likely to use weapons for illegal and violent purposes, as well the provisions giving judges discretion to require surrender of a weapon by a person against whom an order of protection is granted; and

WHEREAS, the provision prohibiting the possession of a gun on a school bus or on school grounds without the written authorization of the school appears to be an effective way to separate children from guns, although probably not from people who seek to use guns for illegal and violent purposes; and

WHEREAS, unfortunately, the tougher assault weapons ban is overly inclusive and ineffective at reducing gun violence by individuals who use guns legally; and

WHEREAS, for example, the Remington 870, classic pump-action shotgun, a very common shotgun used by sportsmen, can be interpreted to fit the new definition of "assault weapon;" and

WHEREAS, further, unlike other provisions, this particular provision does not focus on individuals who use, or are a substantial threat to use, guns illegally and for violent purposes; and

WHEREAS, also, reducing the ammunition magazine size from ten to seven does little to reduce gun violence by individuals using guns illegally, and nothing to reduce gun violence by law abiding gun owners; and

WHEREAS, similarly, statewide recertification of handguns does not reduce the use of guns by individuals who seek to use them illegally; and

WHEREAS, rather, it has the appearance of being an effort by New York State government to fill its coffers with increased fees, without providing for a mechanism to fund county clerks to accommodate the increased workload resulting from this law; and

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment, "A well regulated militia being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed," continues to be a part of the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, New York's SAFE Act appears to contain provisions which infringe upon the Second Amendment rights of its people; and

WHEREAS, as such, the New York SAFE Act should be repealed, revisited, carefully considered, revised and implemented in a manner that is respectful of the Second Amendment rights of New Yorkers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Eric County Legislature hereby supports repeal and revision of the New York SAFE Act of 2013; and be it further

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Andrew Cuomo, Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver, Senate Majority Leaders Dean Skelos and Jeffrey Klein and the local delegation to the New York State Legislature.

Association of Erie County Governments Resolution to Amend the NY SAFE Act

- WHEREAS, The Association of Erie County Governments who represents the voice of the people, is made up of 25 Towns, 16 Villages and 3 Cities that represent the County of Erie, in the State of New York with a population of approximately 1,000,000 people, and
- WHEREAS, On Monday January 14th, 2013 the rights under the second Amendment of our Constitution was infringed on without due process, and
- WHEREAS, The Gun Control Bill (S.2230) known as NY SAFE Act was rushed through the Senate & Assembly without a single Public hearing or input from the various Law enforcement agencies located around our State, and
- WHEREAS, Even the State lawmakers did not have time to review the bill as presented leaving questions about implementation and regulation of this new law, and
- WHEREAS, This law should focus on increasing penalties for criminals who use firearms to harm and threaten law abiding citizens and address the issues of mental illness related to violence, and
- **WHEREAS,** The Association of Erie County Governments realizes that NY SAFE Act, gun control law must be repealed and replace the restrictive parts of the enacted law, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Association of Erie County Governments urgently asks Governor Andrew M. Cuomo & the Legislative leaders to suspend this law as soon as possible and to look at all of the aspects of gun control using the proper legal procedure to bring about a law that will address gun control in a more logical manner, focusing on the real issues related to gun control – a law that will strengthen the effect on public safety and not infringe upon our constitutional rights.

This estimate is for replacing existing meter box at the Community Pool. Included is as follows.

- -Remove existing old style meter.
- -Cut back burnt wire and crimp into new meter. Estimate based on wire having adequate length [after cutting] to accommodate crimp.
- Re-pipe existing galvanized pipe into building main power junction.
- -All work inspected. Electrician will set up all appointments with Electrical Inspector and Power Company.

This meter replacement will be difficult due to the size/style differences in current meters from the existing old style. In addition to placing the new meter properly, I feel that when the damaged/burnt wire is removed, the remaining wire will be too short to crimp. This will then involve an additional phase of electrical work.

Additional:

- -Cut existing galvanized pipe down lower to allow adequate access to good wire.
- -Provide proper crimp and outside junction box.

The above additional work is labor intensive. I anticipate needing 1-2 days to complete. Depending on how the existing galvanized conduit comes apart, and what is revealed, there may be additional phases of electrical work needed. This could involve pulling a new line from utility pole to building. I am concerned that the age/condition of the underground line will require it to be replaced. Once the line is exposed, I will be better able to provide a plan/cost for repair or replacement.

- -Estimate based on electric being shut down for 2 days. Please advise if back-up power is
- -Estimate based on Town providing all digging.
