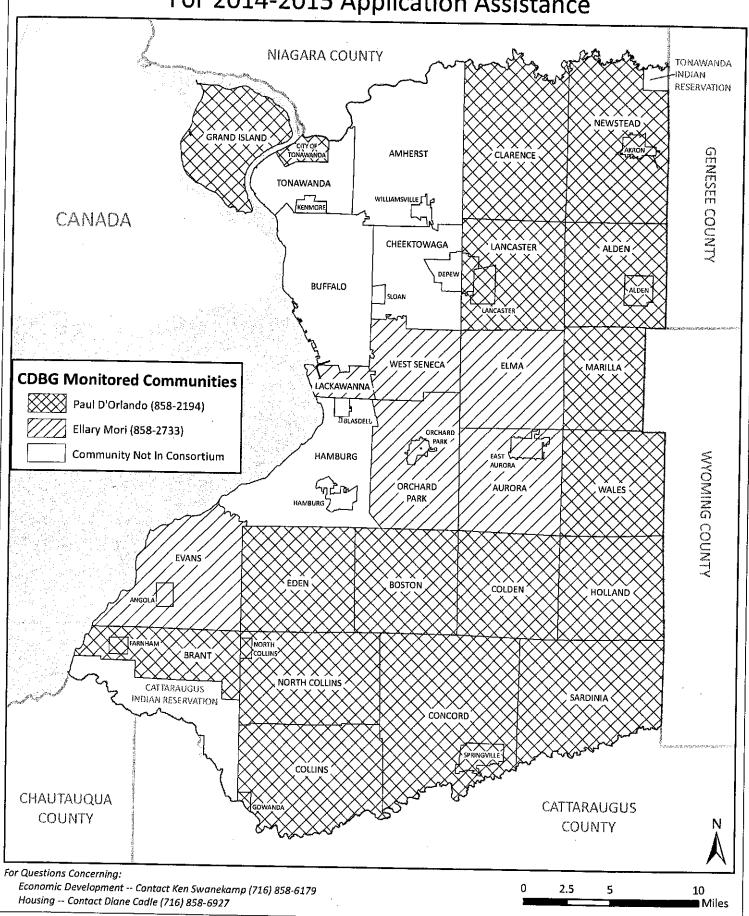

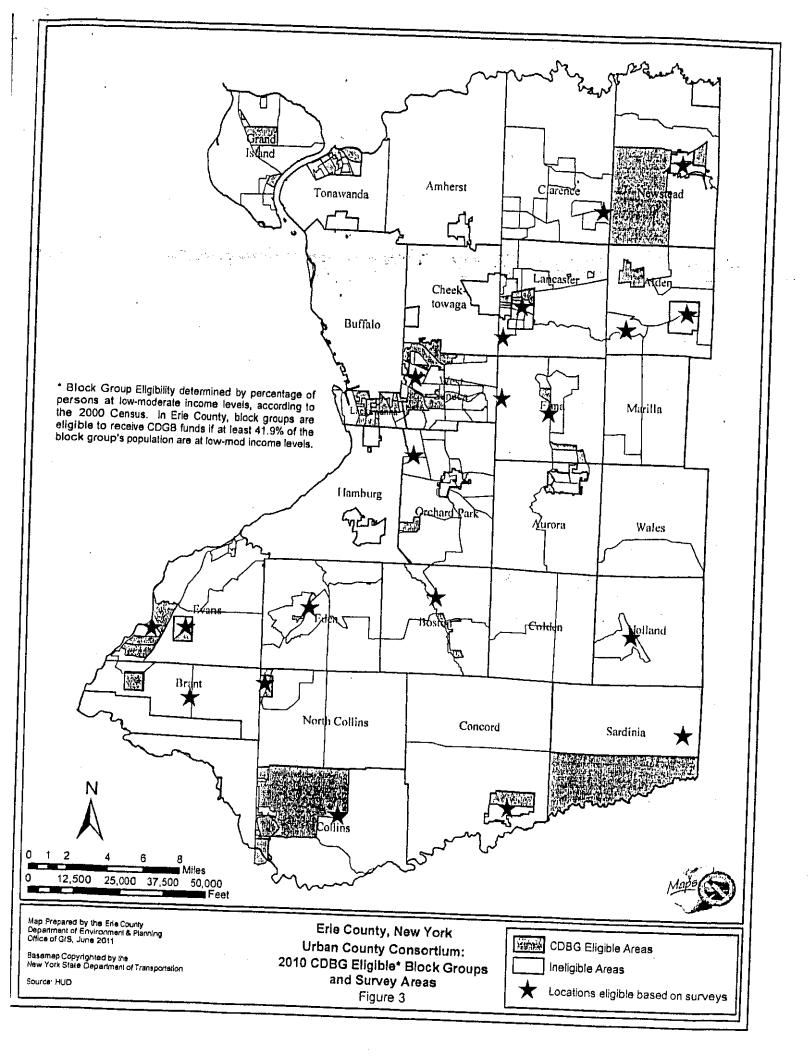

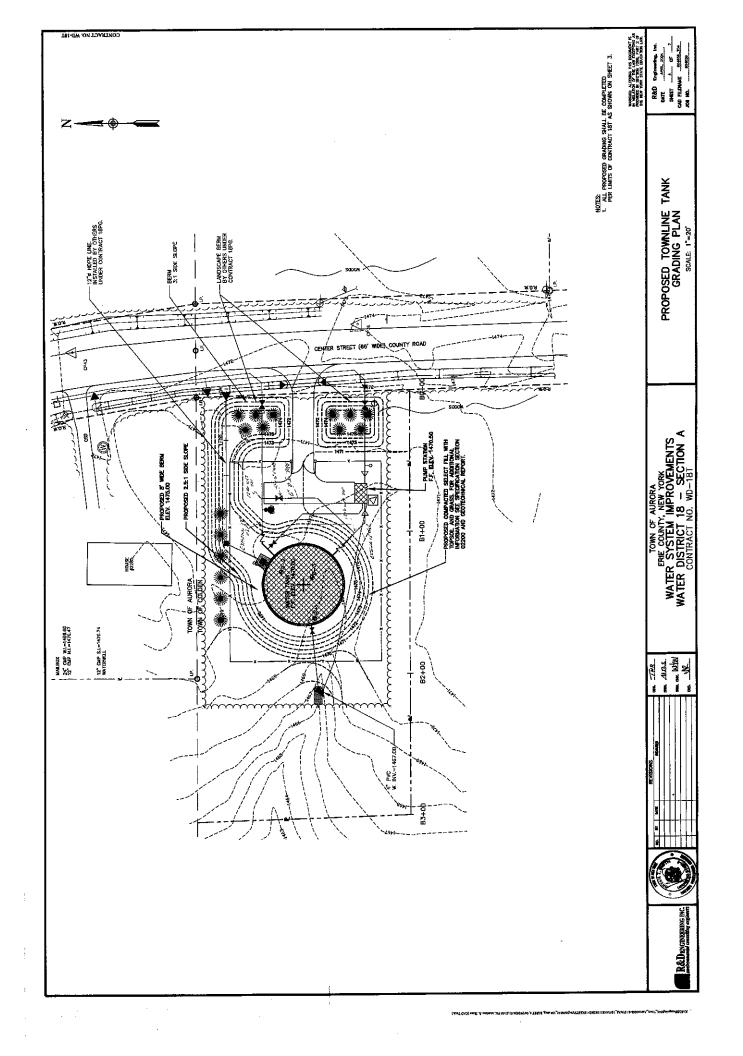

A LOCAL LAW, TO AMEND LOCAL LAW 1-1990 KNOWN AS "THE CODES OF THE TOWN OF AURORA", ADOPTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF AURORA ON JANUARY 22, 1990, BY AMENDING CHAPTER 113 REGARDING

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF AURORA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT

This Local Law amends a prior Local Law known as "The Town of Aurora Code" adopted by the Town of Aurora on January 22, 1990, as amended, relating to the administrative, legislative and general legislation of Codes within the Town of Aurora as therein set forth...

SECTION 2. <u>SECTION 113-34</u>, <u>BILLING PROCEDURE</u>; <u>PENALTY FOR LATE PAYMENTS</u>

Section 116-34 is amended to read as follows:

Checks for payments of water district bills and water charges shall be made payable to the water district. Meters will be read and bills rendered at regular quarterly intervals. Bills for the previous quarter shall be due and payable at the office and on the date designated on the bill. Unpaid water charges,



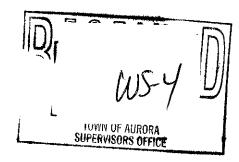

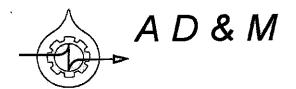

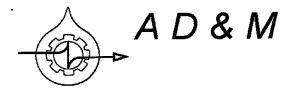
