April 26, 2021

A meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Aurora took place on Monday, April 26, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. The Board met in-person at the Aurora Municipal Center, 575 Oakwood Avenue, East Aurora, New York. Public attendance was allowed at this meeting. The meeting was live-streamed via Zoom and YouTube.

Supervisor Bach opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m., following the conclusion of the work session.

The first item on the agenda was a FURTHER PUBLIC HEARING on a proposed Local Law for the rezoning of 730 Olean Road from RR and A to R3. The notice of public hearing was published in the East Aurora Advertiser and posted on the Town Clerk's bulletin board.

Supervisor Bach opened the hearing at 7:01 p.m. and asked if anyone in the audience wished to comment on this Local Law.

Jim Oubre, Maple St., E. Aurora, stated he is a former ROC board member and current volunteer at ROC. He believes the use should be unrestricted and is concerned they will not be able to have worship services. Councilwoman Friess responded that religious activity is allowed. Hearing no further questions or comments, the Supervisor closed the hearing at 7:05 p.m.

Councilman Snyder stated that this local law is for the rezoning of the property, not for the Special Use Permit and Site Plan review that are required to be completed.

Councilwoman Jeffe stated that the R3 zoning is the most restrictive to permit the project and that she understands the position of ROC and of the neighbors.

Councilwoman Friess moved to approve the minutes of the 4/12/2021Action #104work session and meeting; seconded by Councilman Snyder. Upon a vote4/12/21being taken: ayes – fivenoes – noneMotion carried.

AUDIENCE I:

Krystal Dedrick, Olean Road, (via zoom), stated she is opposed to the rezoning of 730 Olean Road, noting police reports and incidents and stated that restrictions are appropriate.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Councilman Wochensky moved to adopt Local Law 2-2021, a Local Law to rezone 730 Olean Road from RR and A to R3; seconded by Councilman Snyder:

TOWN OF AURORA

LOCAL LAW NO. 2-2021

A LOCAL LAW, TO AMEND LOCAL LAW 1-1990 KNOWN AS "THE CODES OF THE TOWN OF AURORA", ADOPTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF AURORA ON JANUARY 22, 1990 BY AMENDING THE ZONING MAP.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF AURORA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT

This Local Law amends a prior Local Law known as "The Town of Aurora Code" adopted by the Town of Aurora on January 22, 1990, as amended, relating to the administrative, legislative and general legislation of Codes within the Town of Aurora as therein set forth. This Local Law will amend the boundaries of the Zone Map to transfer the described property from its present location in A and RR Zoning Districts to an R-3 Zoning District to accommodate the uses contained herein, or its successors.

SECTION 2. SECTION 116-6, ZONE MAP

Section 116-6(A), Zone Map, of the Codes of the Town of Aurora is amended to transfer and place the following described property from its present classification as A and RR District to an R-3 Zoning District:

All that Tract or Parcel of Land, situate in the Town of Aurora, County of Erie and State of New York, being part of Lots Nos. 13 and 14, Township 9, Range 6 of the Holland Land Company's Survey, described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point in the centerline of Olean Road at the southwest corner of lands conveyed to Daniel C. Clark and wife by deed recorded in the Erie County Clerk's Office in Liber 8349 of Deeds at page 149; thence easterly along the south line of said lands, 266.8 feet; thence northerly along an easterly line of said lands, 241.8 feet; thence easterly along a southerly line of said lands, 453.5 feet to the west line of lands of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company; thence southeasterly at an interior angle of 104° 18' 00" along the west line of said Railroad, a distance of 313.70 feet; thence southwesterly at an interior angle of 98° 24' 00" a distance of 853.11 feet to the center line of Olean Road; thence northwesterly along the centerline of Olean Road, 446 feet to the point or place of beginning.

SECTION 3. <u>RESTRICTIONS ON USE</u>

Rezoning of the real property to R-3 is for the following uses, which are subject to the adoption of a Special Use Permit:

- 1. Assembly Hall or auditorium with the intended building to include offices, a chapel and multi-purpose rooms for non-profit institutions for charitable, religious, cultural or community social purposes, not including institutions for mental patients, correctional facilities, or animal rescue purposes. All non-profit institutions are subject to site plan review regulations of Chapter 95, regardless of occupancy classification or the size of the building.
- 2. Customary accessory uses;
- 3. A Declaration of Restrictive Covenants citing the Restrictions on Use shall be recorded at the Erie County Clerk's Office and shall expressly state that the restrictions contained therein cannot be amended or rescinded without the permission of the Town Board of the Town of Aurora.

If any portion, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion thereof contained in this Local Law is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion thereof.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York Secretary of State.

Councilwoman Jeffe seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken: ayes – five noes - none Motion carried.

Councilwoman Friess moved to approve and authorize the Supervisor to sign an agreement between the Town and Town Wreckers Swim Team to use Community Pool for competitive swimming practice from 5/3 to 5/28/2021; Monday thru Friday from 3:15 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Councilwoman Jeffe seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken: ayes – five noes – none Motion carried.

Councilman Wochensky moved to approve and authorize the Supervisor to sign an agreement between the Town and Hamburg Swim Club to use Community Pool for competitive swimming practice from 5/3 to 6/27/2021, Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Councilman Snyder seconded the motion.
